ONE-OFF PROJECT FUNDING FOR COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS

Community Benefit SA invites funding applications for Round 17 one-off project grants up to \$35,000 from non-government, non-profit, incorporated community organisations that provide assistance for disadvantaged individuals and communities.
