1. Young volunteers got the public attention at the time of ;

① Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake in January 1995

(2) Heavy oil spill in Japan Sea by Vessel Nakhodka in 1997

2. Government launched "Good Practice" program in 2007 / 2008 to cope with social needs and provide assistance grant funding to the schools who proposed the program of fresh idea, effective means and unique way.

Funding support continued 4 years for university and 2 years for college Total 93 proposals were accepted and implemented by school

3. How many schools have function to deal students' volunteering?

Out of 1,254 schools (10.8% of National or Public university/college 89.2% of Private ones) Excludes 2,995 vocational school

<u>80% schools</u> answered "We have function to deal students' volunteering".

90% hold the concurrent post like Student Affairs Dept.


10% (119 schools) has independently established volunteer center (*)


- **1. Educational Significance based on School Philosophy:**

IVUSA (1993~) (International Volunteer University Student Association)

- It was started with "Dream Plan" that Kokushikan University announced to empower the young students in apathetic generation. Receiving all kinds of application over the country, the university people found their strong enthusiasm to make a social contribution. Three program were accepted and actually run. The students' motivation lead to organize the IVUSA for the action continue.
- •Now it becomes the BIGGEST student organization in Japan, holding <u>2,300 student members from over 90 universities</u>. IVUSA is association that respects students' autonomy and they choose board members/president every year by election. To become members is all at his/her own will.
- •Main Activities; International cooperation, Environmental conservation, Local revitalization, Disaster-relief (3,266 students to Tohoku earthquake)

YOUTH VISION (1996~)

It was started by the volunteers who participated in Hanshin-Awaji earthquake in 1995. The first 4 students volunteer from Ritsumeikan University established "Kyoto Student Volunteer Center" in 1996 and then renamed to "Youth Visiton" in 2005 to reinforce its stability.

- Advisory support and Seminar/Forum for ;
 - -- Establishment of youth volunteer receiving system or structure
 - -- Settling up of university volunteer center
- Coordination for ;
 - -- NPO Internship program to nurture the young leader
 - -- Job information and placement at NPO
- Networking among NPO young staff and volunteers for career-up


GAKUVO (2012~) (GAKU=Students/VO=Volunteer)

• It was started by Nippon Foundation to inspire and develop the young students and university volunteer organization after the "Tohoku" earthquake.

• Main Activities ;

- Gakuvo Style Fund
 - -- Financial support to the youth organization
- Lecture and Seminar on volunteering at university
- Coordinate students volunteers to join and experience volunteer activities in the school curriculum or ex-curriculum
- Training, Seminar and Symposium
